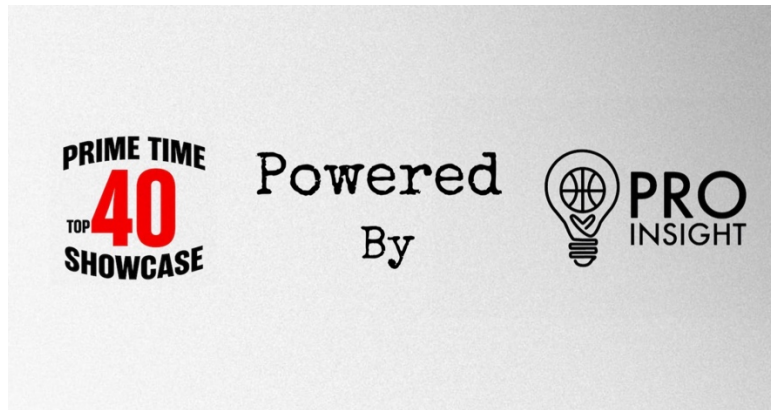


STANDOUTS BY CLASS - 2020

Matt McKay, Jr. - Pro Insight

Mutdung Bol / Edmonds-Woodway HS (WA) / 2020 / CG / 6'3.5 / 145lbs. / 6'4 WS / 18.0

Recruitment: has received interest from Cleveland State, Eastern Washington and Portland State

- Thin frame, but much tougher than he looks
- Super confident and assertive court demeanor
- Bouncy in space
- Big time motor. Steps onto the court with an intensity rarely matched by his opponents...
- Has the ball on a string. Can really generate offense at a high level. Wired to score
- Advanced mid-range game. Good touch from both midrange and from deep. High-level pull-up jumper
- Battles on D. Covers an incredible amount of ground. Seems like he's in two places at once, sometimes

Bottom Line: Bol is a *winner!* He impacts the game on both ends almost every possession. When he's not in the game, he's the first one on his feet waving a towel cheering on his teammates. His frame is underdeveloped in some ways vs. his peers, but he finds ways to compensate. He's a hard player not to root for.

Brian Goracke / Churchill HS (OR) / 2020 / W / 6'5.5 / 205lbs. / 6'9 WS / 17.2

Recruitment: has received interest from Navy, UMKC, Point Loma, Northwest Nazarene University, Western Oregon, Biola, and Colorado Christian

- Very solid positional size on the wing
- Versatile - can plug him in at a variety of positions and his skillset complements just about any lineup combination
- Good athlete - can really elevate off his L foot, especially. Above-the-rim finisher
- High BBIQ. Heady and unselfish. Rarely makes a dumb mistake
- Simplifies things on O...does a good job of making the easy play
- Floor-spacer. Solid shooting stroke. Very well-balanced. College 3 range

- Very fundamentally sound, all around
- Smart team defender — usually finds himself in the right place at the right time
- Was unusually quiet in the games, but still left a positive imprint. Doesn't need the ball in his hands a ton to provide value

Bottom Line: Goracke is a big, versatile, lanky wing with a good feel for the game. Competes. Just a mature player. Will help a team win at the college level. No frills, here — what you see is what you get.

Kaelan O'Neil / Churchill HS (OR) / 2020 / G / 6'3 / 163lbs. / 6'6 WS / 18.3

Recruitment: Committed to Eastern Washington University

- Decent size for an off-guard. Plus-length that he uses to his advantage - doesn't have an issue getting to his spots
- Competes! Plays chippy, too. Type of guy you want on your team but don't enjoy playing against
- High motor. High BBIQ. Advanced feel for the game
- Does not lack in the confidence department
- Crafty as a playmaker. Has some real flair to his game - not afraid to take chances
- Flashed some impressive court vision throughout the event
- Capable of finishing with either hand at the rim
- Keeps the defense honest as a shooter. Tough cover with his ability to shoot, pass and handle

Bottom Line: O'Neill had a really good showing, overall. Not a traditional PG, but will be able to serve as a secondary playmaker on the perimeter. O appears to be ahead of his D at this stage, but a college strength program should help balance that scale.

Emanuel Steward / Grant HS (OR) / 2020 / CG / 6'3 / 169lbs. / 6'6.5 WS / 17.5

Recruitment: no current offers

- On the younger side for his class. Still has time on his side in terms of his development curve
- Impressive length and positional size as a CG
- Solid athlete. More well-coordinated than anything else. Good "mover"
- Smart player. High BBIQ
- Skilled passer capable of making good decisions with the ball
- Capable of scoring in bunches
- Strikes a good balance between scoring vs. distributing
- Disruptive, effective on-ball defender
- 2-way impact player. Brings something to the table on both ends of the floor

Bottom Line: Steward was one of the best players on the court for long stretches, throughout the event. Completely showed out in his team's second of three games — accounted for the majority of his team's points early via scoring and setting up his teammates. Can get hot from the outside if left open. He appears to be completely under-recruited up to this point. With the 2020 season's runway in front of him, don't expect that to be the case for long.

Tanner Toolson / Union HS (WA) / 2020 / 6'4.5 / 179lbs. / 6'6 WS / 17.8

Recruitment: has received interest from Utah Valley University and University of Portland

- Brings solid size and versatility out on the perimeter
- Well-built and has an already-strong frame that will be able to add more functional muscle
- Plus-athlete. Will catch you off guard with his vertical athleticism. Had some impressive athletic finishes in the paint in live play throughout the event
- Can shoot it. Capable out to the college 3 line. Clean mechanics
- Has the tools to defend and effectively contain penetration
- Plays within himself and impacts the game positively without having to be high usage

Bottom Line: Toolson was a pleasant surprise at the event. He will be able to get away with playing both 2 and 3 at the next level. No major weaknesses, here. Expect a big senior season from this guy in 2019-20 and for his recruitment to continue to pick up as a result.
